MDCLC RESOLUTION NO. 2023-2

IN SUPPORT OF INCREASED PUBLIC DEFENDER'S OFFICE SALARIES

WHEREAS the member Cities of the Miami-Dade County League of Cities (MDCLC) supports the efforts of the Miami-Dade Office of the Public Defender to ensure the right of counsel;

WHEREAS the community's well-being depends on the proper staffing and functioning of all pillars of the criminal justice system, including the Miami-Dade County Public Defender's Office (Miami PD);

WHEREAS qualified and tenured public servants are critical to the system of justice;

WHEREAS Florida ranks 49th in the nation for public defender pay, and funds each judicial circuit according to a formula that does not reflect the high costs of living in the Miami Metropolitan Area (Miami);

WHEREAS Miami is the most expensive major urban housing market in the nation as of February 2022;

WHEREAS core inflation, and the shelter index in Miami (10.4% and 17.2%, respectively) is significantly higher than the national rate (5.7% and 7.5%);

WHEREAS the Federal government recognizes that jurisdictions like Miami have unusually high costs of living and provides their employees with a 23.8% locality adjustment;

WHEREAS the Florida Legislature recognizes Miami's extremely high cost of living and provides Florida Highway Patrol (FHP) Troopers and Florida Department of Law Enforcement (FDLE) Agents with a \$5,000 area pay adjustment;

WHEREAS the Legislature has not provided any locality adjustment for Miami PD employees;

WHEREAS starting Miami PDs earn about half as much as their counterparts in the private sector, and significantly less than they can earn at many other governmental agencies;

WHEREAS the average law student graduates with \$160,000 in student debt;

WHEREAS the Miami PD's ability to recruit and retain attorneys and staff is at an all-time low due to the very high cost of living in Miami;

WHEREAS Miami open felonies are 21% higher than they were prior to the pandemic;

WHEREAS the Miami PD currently has over 40 vacant defender positions (as of March 2023), and this staffing shortfall is hampering the Miami PD's ability to properly to its job;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MIAMI-DADE COUNTY LEAGUE OF CITIES BOARD OF DIRECTORS THAT:

<u>Section 1. Recitals.</u> The foregoing "WHEREAS" clauses are ratified and confirmed a being true and correct and are made a specific part of this Resolution.

<u>Section 2. Positions.</u> The Miami Dade County League of Cities supports the PD'S financial proposals for stabilizing the Miami PD staffing crisis, and urges the Legislature to adopt them.

The aforementioned proposals are:

- 1. Increase public defender salaries by \$15,000;
- 2. Provide an 8.3% cost-of-living adjustment;
- 3. Provide funding for a locality pay differential for Miami PD employees, in the same manner as done for other State agencies, to account for the Miami's high cost of living and housing.

<u>Section 3. Transmittal.</u> The MDCLC hereby transmits a copy of this Resolution to Governor Ron DeSantis, Senate President Kathleen Passidomo, and House Speaker Paul Renner.

<u>Section 4. Effective Date.</u> This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon its adoption.
