

Executive Director Richard Kuper introduced Miami-Dade County Clerk of the Court Juan Fernandez-Barquin, who presented a proclamation on behalf of the Clerk's office to President Cunningham. Mr. Fernandez-Barquin expressed his gratitude to President Cunningham for her dedication to the Village of Palmetto Bay, the League, and the community recognized her 35 years of service to the school system. He then announced that September 12th would be recognized as "Karyn Cunningham Day". President Cunningham thanked Mr. Fernandez-Barquin for the honor and acknowledged him for all his work.

At each meeting, the League spotlights an Associate Member for their support and commitment to the organization. President Cunningham introduced CEO Albert Sotero, Emergency Sandbag Response (ESR), as the featured Associate Member for this meeting. Mr. Sotero spoke about the growing threat of flooding in our community. In response, ESR has developed a faster and more efficient method for filling sandbags to combat floods. Their system, which eliminates the need for strenuous labor and shovels, can fill a sandbag in just three seconds. Additionally, the system is mobile, allowing multiple units to be deployed simultaneously across different locations. While traditional methods may seem effective, ESR's solution is especially advantageous in the face of short-notice storms. They have already partnered with municipalities such as the City of West Miami, City of Miami Gardens, and City of North Miami. Mr. Sotero encouraged attendees to contact him if their city is interested in implementing this innovative approach.

President Cunningham introduced Louis Fonseca, Louis Fonseca Productions, inviting him to speak about the 3rd Annual Pig Roast Bowl Series – Benefiting the Love Fund. Mr. Fonseca began by expressing his gratitude to the League and President Cunningham for the opportunity to speak at the meeting. He extended a personal invitation to all attendees to join this year's Pig Roast Bowl Series, scheduled for November 16, 2024 from 10:00 A.M. to 6:00 P.M. The event, to be held at Miami-Dade County's Tropical Park, will honor fallen law enforcement officers, show appreciation to their families, and celebrate the contributions of first responders, law enforcement, and firefighters. With more than 100 teams and over 500 participants expected, the day promises to unite the community in a meaningful way. Mr. Fonseca also highlighted available sponsorship opportunities and welcomed attendees to bring their families to the event.



Dear Members of the Miami-Dade County League of Cities,

On behalf of the City of North Miami, I am pleased to extend a warm welcome as the co-host of this month's board meeting alongside our neighbor City of North Miami Beach. Together, we stand as pillars of progress, resilience, and community in Miami-Dade County, working to uplift the lives of our residents through innovative governance and a shared vision for a brighter future. As one of the fastest-growing cities in our region, North Miami is committed to leading with purpose in several key areas, each aims at improving the quality of life for our residents and strengthening the bonds that unite us as a community.

In 2023, we made substantial advancements in public safety. Under the leadership of Police Chief Cherise Giordani Gause, the North Miami Police Department achieved a 16% reduction in violent crime while securing accreditation from the Commission for Florida Law Enforcement Accreditation. Programs like the Guardian Program, which focuses on Missing Persons Tracking and Recovery, have further solidified our commitment to 21st-century policing, ensuring transparency and community engagement. We have also expanded the capabilities of our Neighborhood Services Department, with initiatives such as the illegal dumping "Dream Team", which has significantly reduced incidents of illegal dumping in our community. This effort has not only beautified our city but has led to considerable fiscal savings.

Moreover, we recognize that infrastructure is the backbone of any thriving city. Our Development Services Department spearheaded significant projects, including the approval of a 30-story residential tower at Sole Mia and numerous other development initiatives that are reshaping our urban landscape. Moreover, our Public Works Department successfully upgraded over 3 miles of water and sewer pipes and secured federal grants to implement Vision Zero, a plan that aims to eliminate traffic fatalities and serious injuries by creating safer streets. Also, the introduction of the Freebee electric vehicle transportation system has further enhanced mobility within North Miami, offering residents a sustainable, on-demand solution for getting around our city.

North Miami has also taken bold steps toward economic growth. Our Economic Development Division's NoMi Tech initiative is opening doors for underrepresented communities to thrive in the tech industry, and programs such as the Smart Biz E-Commerce Grant have empowered local businesses to succeed in the digital

marketplace. Financial stewardship remains a priority, with North Miami's Finance Department receiving the Government Finance Officers Association Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting. This underscores our commitment to fiscal transparency and accountability.

We continue to strengthen our social fabric through a range of services that prioritize the well-being of all residents. From youth programs like Leaders in Training and the Youth Opportunity Board Summer Internships to our Home Rehabilitation Program, which helped revitalize nearly 30 homes, our focus on fostering opportunity and empowerment is unwavering. In 2023, our Parks and Recreation Department enhanced community spaces, upgrading facilities like Claude Pepper Park and hosting over 42 special events that brought our residents together in celebration and unity.



Aerial schematic showing possible development outcome


- Proposed location is a state-managed site located at 151 Perviz Avenue, across from the historic Opa-locka Historic City Hall, and at the center of the downtown district
- Existing structure built in the early 2000s boasts 46,770 square feet of space split between to large structures and with a central connecting outdoor courtyard of striking Moorish design
 - Downtown Opa-locka is within a short distance to several higher-education institutions, transportation hubs, and industrial complexes with large work forces, such as Amazon
- Select lots surrounding the site will be redeveloped to increase density and provide mixed-income, multi-family apartments, as well as new commercial spaces

About the City of Opa-locka

- Established on May 14, 1926, Miami-Dade's oldest municipality, a Florida Main Street community, and a transportation-oriented development (TOD)
 - 4.2 square miles in size, population of 16,500+, connected to all major transportation systems, with a passenger station located directly in the heart of the city, with a direct connection to Miami. Became the first city in northern Dade to racially integrate beginning in the 1960s, with today's
- Experiencing a transformative revitalization, with new housing developments and cultural experiences, such as the Opa-locka Heritage Trail, walking tours, and the annual event 'Art of Transformation'
